

Measuring up SEAL

EDI IS LAUNCHING SEAL measure, a powerful new online assessment package designed to help teachers gauge the emotional intelligence of pupils across five domains – determining their level of self-awareness, ability to manage feelings, motivation, empathy and social skills.

Developed in conjunction with Professor Katherine Weare, SEAL adviser to the DCSF, and Professor Robin Banerjee, senior lecturer in psychology at the University of Sussex, SEAL measure will help schools meet the requirements of the Social and Emotional Aspects of Learning programme, largely developed by the National Strategies and highlighted in Sir Alan Steer's report *Learning Behaviour: Lessons Learned – A Review of Behaviour Standards and Practices in Schools*.

EDI's SEAL measure consists of 56 items covering the five SEAL domains and also awareness of social and emotional difficulties. Pupils select a response to each item and each assessment typically takes less than 30 minutes to complete. Results are displayed immediately and reports produced at the touch of a button. Teachers can choose from reports displaying percentage scores for each SEAL domain and average across the class, or individual pupil reports giving the pupil's percentage scores and a brief explanatory statement for each domain. Reports can be printed or saved electronically.

SEAL measure is available as a stand-alone module or as part of EDI's GOAL Online Assessment for Learning system.
