A PRIMARY school in inner city Birmingham has emerged top of the class after being presented with a Centre of Excellence award.

The prestige prize went to Prince Albert Junior and Infants, at Albert Road, Aston, in recognition of its work in pupil development and its innovative approach to assessment.

The award from qualifications and assessment specialist Education Development International follows two ICT Excellence Awards in 2007 from Government agency Becta.

Headteacher Hilary Pugh said: "Our school has gone from strength to strength in the past few years.

"Our results have shown a significant improvement in pupil attainment across all areas of the curriculum this year and our use of ICT within assessment has contributed to this success."
